

Indiana Human Trafficking Juvenile Intake Screening Tool

If the juvenile has an open placement case in KidTraks/I-KIDS and has been recovered from a runaway episode, this form *MUST* be completed in KidTraks/I-KIDS in the juvenile's open case. Also, if this form suggests the juvenile has been trafficked, you *MUST* make a report to the Indiana Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline immediately.

- **If a YES response is noted for any one of the observations/red flags** in the table below, the juvenile will be considered a suspected victim of human trafficking/commercially sexually exploited child (CSEC) and you **must** make a report to the DCS hotline for an investigation.
- The person using this Screening Tool is responsible for calling the DCS hotline at **1-800-800-5556** without delay and reporting the child as a potential victim of Human Trafficking/CSEC to DCS if there is suspicion of abuse, neglect, or if the child is a suspected victim of human trafficking. You should use the phrase VICTIM OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING when making the report.

CURRENT/PAST HISTORY

If there is a current runaway episode or history of running away or getting kicked out, in addition to any combination of two of the indicators noted below, then you must make a report to the DCS hotline for an investigation **1-800-800-5556**. (Definition of running away or getting kicked out of home includes failures to voluntarily return home within 24 hours, and includes incidents not reported to law enforcement.) You may report the juvenile to the DCS hotline for an investigation without two or more indicators at your discretion.

- Current incident or history of risky sexual behaviors (not limited to prostitution)
- No personal items or possessions (including identity documents if foreign born, as this may indicate labor trafficking)
- Is not allowed or unable to speak for themselves and may be extremely fearful or submissive
- Has a history of sexual abuse (either as victim or perpetrator)
- Appears to have material items that they cannot afford (e.g. more than one cell phone, expensive clothing, grooming habits, tablets, cash, hotel keys, etc.)
- Has no knowledge about the community in which they are located
- Tracking chips, suspicious tattoos or other signs of branding (e.g. traffickers' names/nicknames, dollar signs, diamonds, stars, money bags, MOB, etc. May also have certain designs/logos on nails, jewelry, etc.)
- Juvenile lives, associates, and/or has relationship with age-inappropriate friends, boyfriends, or girlfriends or adults
- Known to associate with confirmed or suspected victims of human trafficking/CSEC

- Law enforcement reports behaviors or circumstances indicative of juvenile being trafficked
- Juvenile shows signs of being groomed (i.e. hair done, nails done, new clothing, etc. that child cannot afford)
- Juvenile is in possession of sex toys, multiple condoms, lube or lingerie in personal property inventory.
- Juvenile has history of multiple or chronic STI's, abortions, or other sexually related infections
- Juvenile is having contact and/or inappropriate/risky relationships with people from other states/countries through the internet/social media
- Current incident or history of nude photos, pornographic photos/videos, sending or posting self on websites, nude or explicit images (sending or posting) of themselves or other juveniles
- Juvenile has evidence of malnutrition, bruising, physical injuries

Recommendations:

- Complete the Screening Tool at Detention Center Intake, during first probation contact with the juvenile, and/or during subsequent probation contact with juvenile, as warranted. For counties WITH detention centers, this screening may occur at Intake at the Detention Center. For counties WITHOUT detention centers, this screening may occur during a call from law enforcement, or when a paper referral to probation is received during the completion of the Preliminary Inquiry. **This Screening Tool may also be completed or re-administered by probation at any time during probation supervision, as warranted.**
- Juvenile who score for referral for investigation MUST be reported as potential victims of Human Trafficking/CSEC to DCS—**1-800-800-5556**.
- Juvenile will be investigated by individuals trained to perform Human Trafficking/CSEC Assessments.
- If any individual completing this screening tool has any questions, they may refer to the training manual.
